

Grant stuff

- Familiarize yourself with local granting organizations
 - Community Foundations
 - o City Initiatives
 - See what they have funded in the past: (example: Blackhawk County Gaming Commission bought symphony a harpsichord.)
- Try to read sample grants. (Usually organizations will offer a resource of a few successful grant applications.)
- Does your state have a Commission for the Arts, or Arts Council, or Department of Humanity? Or, are there independent arts councils in your city or region?

- Do you want to use a fiscal sponsor? (Fractured Atlas)
- Elements of a good grant application
 - o Clear, concise, and engaging language
 - A balance between hard facts/data and creative-passion-pros
 - What is your proposal? Is it too broad and/or farfetched? Is it too narrow?
 - Do you have a track record of completed similar proposals that the organization can latch on to?
 - How widespread and diverse can your proposal be, all the while presenting what seems to be a doable project?
 - Sections you'll have to write:

 - Memorandum Of Understanding (MOU) from collaborators
 - Past, present, future fiscal year budgets
- Accepted grant proposals will do many things. Most proposals have most of these items.
 - Bring together multiple entities and involve a variety of people
 - Show viable examples of additional funding
 - Show a doable timeline
 - Have merit in the field
 - Be valuable in some way to the granting organization
 - Exemplifies some element of education, diversity, collaboration, or community connection.
- Matching grants and project financial plans
 - o Some greats will require you to show a source for matching funds.
 - o In-kind cash
 - o If the full grant isn't funded, where is the rest of the money coming from?
 - Fundraiser(s) Crowd-funding, live events
 - Other grants
 - Other revenue
 - In-kind
 - Sponsors
 - Individual donations
